PostNL uses Voltia solutions to decarbonize Dutch island deliveries with electric vehicles

Den Haag – Today, PostNL, the Dutch national postal and parcel delivery service, announced that it will be using Voltia’s zero emission all-electric delivery vans to achieve its goal of completely decarbonizing its operations on Terschelling Island.

After a successful pilot period, PostNL is now employing three Voltia zero emission vehicles; an all-electric 3,5 ton [Citroen Jumper](#) and two [Nissan eNV200 Maxis](#).
